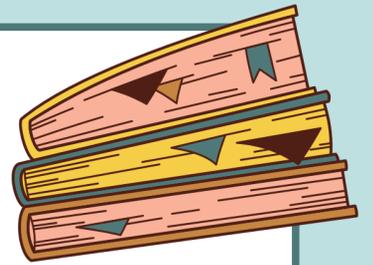




COMMA USAGE

WHEN TO USE



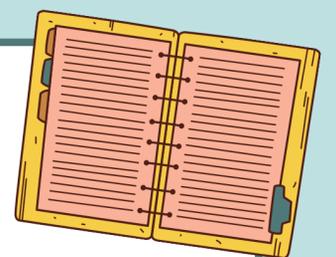
- Use commas to separate items in a list.
- Use a comma before and, but, or so in a sentence.
- Use a comma after an opening word or phrase.
- Use commas in dates, places, and big numbers.
- Use a comma when talking to someone by name.



EXAMPLE

- 1. Use commas to separate items in a list.
 - Example: I packed apples, sandwiches, and water.
 - Explanation: Commas help separate each item so the list is clear
- 2. Use a comma before and, but, or so in a sentence.
 - Example: I wanted to play outside, but it started raining.
 - Explanation: The comma shows a pause before joining two ideas.
